## Dealing with G.E.R.D.



What is G.E.R.D. ? G.E.R.D. stands for Gastro-Esophageal Reflux Disease.

It occurs when the barrier between the stomach and tube from the throat (the esophagus) fails to close properly.

## **Common Symptoms**

! Frequent Heartburn

! Stomach contents comes

up into throat

! Chest Pain

! Swallowing problems

! Hoarseness

! Asthma

! Coughing

! Wheezing

! Vocal cords

inflamed

## Lifestyle Changes to Treat

- Lose weight
- Wear loose clothing
- Sit up after meals
- Go to bed 3-4 hours after meals
- 6-8 inch blocks under head of bed



## **Medical Treatment**

- Various medicines
  - Antacids
  - Foams that coat the stomach
  - Medicines that reduce acid made by stomach
  - Medicines that speed up stomach emptying
- Surgery as last resort
